



## WCA wants to know where candidates stand

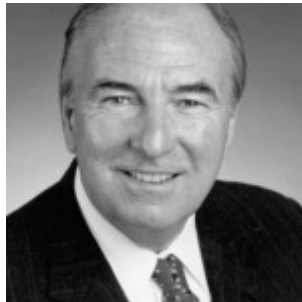

With so many issues facing Westchester taxpayers and businesses — high taxes, government consolidation, MTA payroll tax, property revaluation and a federal housing settlement — the Westchester County Association wants to know how the candidates for public office plan to address them.

The WCA last week sent out a questionnaire that was developed by its members. It is due back tomorrow.

The WCA plans to analyze the answers and publish them at its annual government reception Oct. 21 at The Ritz-Carlton, Westchester, in White Plains.



“Our members want clear answers from the candidates about how they will deal with issues that are important to Westchester’s economic vitality,” said William M. Mooney, WCA’s President. “We trust that this will provide the information that the business community needs to make informed voting decisions.”
