ACCELERATOR BOOST LEADS TO PLANGURU'S SOLID GROWTH

It was a celebration of entrepreneurial spirit at the 2015 kickoff meeting of Accelerate Westchester, the WCA's networking group for business innovators, which feted PlanGuru, the BLUEPRINT Accelerator's first amazing graduate at the Reckson Center in White Plains.

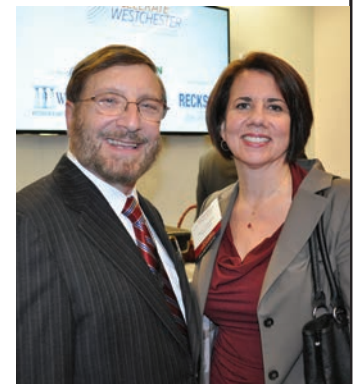
Since joining the Accelerator in 2013, PlanGuru, a business budgeting and forecasting software company, increased its customer base by 350 percent, launched two new products, and started a round of meetings with investors for their Series B financing—a level of growth not possible without the WCA, said Christian Wielage, PlanGuru's CEO. The White Plains-based company also upped their staff from five to eleven employees here and in Europe, where their market is expanding.

"It's been a terrific experience," said Wielage, who also thanked the companies that provided services and counsel through the Accelerator Network. Over a dozen early stage companies now enjoy the perks of Accelerator membership: access to financing and mentoring, rent-free office space in the first year, and complimentary professional services. Following the graduation ceremony, a panel of legal experts addressed critical issues in IP law for startups. Speakers included Elizabeth Barnhard, Leason Ellis; Donna Frosco, Law Offices of Donna Frosco, Esq.; and Jess Collen, Collen IP. Launched last year to offer a forum for startups to share tips, address common challenges, and meet like-minded innovators, Accelerate Westchester now includes over 250 entrepreneurs in Westchester and the region.

Our goal was to stimulate innovation in a new way, and groom the next generation of business leaders in Westchester. We've attracted a diverse group of companies, and are leading the way for today's startups to become tomorrow's established enterprises."

Follow Your Passion: DR. RAJ RATAN'S Candid Conversation with Westchester's YPs

That's the question Dr. Rajiv R. Ratan posed to Westchester's young emerging business leaders at an exclusive event for WCA's Young Professionals. Ratan, a professor of neurology and neuroscience at the Burke Medical Research Institute and associate dean at the Weill Cornell Medical College, is widely regarded as a leader in cutting edge neurological and rehabilitation medicine. He followed his passion.

In 2002, Ratan joined the team at Burke Medical Research Institute, where he has recruited and retained many top-notch scientists. Prior to joining Burke, he set up the Neuroprotection Laboratory in the Department of Neurology and Neuroscience at Harvard Medical School and served as an associate professor at Harvard Medical School. He was formally appointed professor of neurology and neuroscience at Weill Cornell Medical College in 2004 and named an associate dean of the medical college in 2011.

"His competitive spirit and love for what he does was inspirational and motivational," said Joseph McCoy, a YP executive board member and commercial loan team leader at People's United Bank. "I left the event thinking, we should all follow our passion!"
